News from Holy Three-in-One Lutheran Church, Houston, TX

Holy Three-in-One is a small church and has been very quiet for many years that many deaf people did not know that this tiny deaf church has been served God's Word since the 1950's. In November 2017, Rev. Dr. John Reinke started to train two deaf men (Glenn Friedrich and Calvin Friedrich) to become leaders in the congregation. They were scared just like Moses did not want to go back to Egypt to save the Israelites. But it doesn't matter how old we are. God always has plans for us, Jeremiah 29:11

Six months later, the church is still small but the people are slowly waking up with three baptisms and more visitors. Now we have Sunday School being led by Joanie Murdoch. A new ministry called "Family Religious Sign Class" was set up by Lauren Settercerri. This class is held once a month and the purpose of this class is for teaching and acting Bible stories with visual and religious vocabulary signs in ASL. Lunch after church is also being set up at local restaurants once a month. God is good!

Holy Three-in-One makes use of a large TV screen that they didn't have before using power point slides and services are becoming more visual with church liturgy and songs. Technology in the church is slowly improving and just recently we purchased a new printer. The videophone is set up so God is good!

Rev. Mark Seeger still comes twice a month to lead worship. Rev. Reinke also leads worship and while he and Dacia are away from Texas for 4-5 months, he will continue training Glenn and Calvin by videophone weekly. Rev. Reinke is also training me (Becky) as a deaconess.

We want to thank Rev. Reinke for his efforts in training us to save this small Lutheran deaf church. He uses the ABCD classes and the Deaf BLAST resources. If you are interested check out <u>www.lutherandeafoutreach.org</u> to check out more of his resources. God wants us to do as Matthew 28:19 says, "So you must go and make disciples of all nations. Baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

This tiny deaf church encourages you to pray for the church to keep it alive and growing! Please pray for all the Lutheran pastors for the deaf to continue working with deaf people worldwide. Also pray for Rev. Reinke and Dacia to continue their deaf mission work with God's love to the deaf!
